My work does not include any decision making on pest management or any other managerial tasks.</p> <p>I participated in a meeting of an informal working group of the Council Working Party of Chief Officers of National Plant Health Services (COPHS), it was a single event occurred on 2 June 2009. The aim of the meeting was to prepare a proposal for a draft guideline for EC coordination and handling of Pest Risk Analysis documents and other scientific and technical justification documents supporting requests for phytosanitary measures. This did not include any managerial tasks nor decision making. The draft was approved by COPHS of the EU council.</p> <p>The Julius Kühn-Institut (JKI), Federal Research Centre for Cultivated Plants, is both a federal research institute and a higher federal authority. JKI's primary goal is to advise the federal government on all issues relating to cultivated plants. Furthermore, the Institute is in charge of diverse official duties conferred by law.
